Her husband of 29 years is her greatest cheerleader along with their three children, four grand children, and two dogs. She started at a community college, but failed miserly. Then after finishing an AA degree from a private school realized that she was in debt with a degree that was not WASC accredited. She returned to college, as a working mom, then transferred to complete her undergrad, then completed a Masters of Arts in Sociology from Arizona State. She's was undocumented until her senior year in high school, and by the time she was in 9th grade she and her family had moved 25 times, and attended 8 different schools--housing and food insecurity were very familiar to her. She considers herself to be a product of her community, and that's why she is passionate about helping students increase their voice, affirm their identity, and increase their social and cultural capital through service. Currently she serves as the program manager for the Service Learning & Volunteer Center at MiraCosta. When she's not at work she is busy serving her community as a community activist and a community connecter. She's the first Afro-Latina to serve on the board of director for a local shelter for families and single women, Operation HOPE-North County. She's also the first Black Latina to serve as a Housing Commissioner for the City of Oceanside, and is the Chair for the Women of the North San Diego County NAACP. She's a member of the Oceanside Justice Coalition, and co-chairs Racial Justice Committee for the Alliance for Regional Solutions. She's received many community awards and was awarded the Employee of the Year by the Associate Student Government at MiraCosta College, and various other community awards for her work in advocacy and education.
